Recently, one of my sisters sent me a picture of my dad's headstone. My dad died last summer after a prolonged illness. As many of you have experienced, the death of a parent impacts you in ways that continue to unfold over time. It's no different for me.

This picture is the first time I've seen his headstone which provokes a new level of reality to my journey of grief. But, as I think about my dad, my question of "where is the hope" is answered. Everything in his life was rooted in his faith. This was a guy who lived his faith, every single day, in the good and the bad. And there were certainly many bad days he experienced.

Dad was rooted in the love of God, the relationship of Jesus, and the power of the Holy Spirit seen in incarnational moments of life. He never knew how good a man he was. He taught us to have the courage of our convictions, that our word is our bond and that relationships in life are the only things eternal from human life.

There are 5 more months in 2020 and God knows what surprises are yet in store for us. I am bolstered by the legacy of my dad's life, his faith. Regardless of what is to come I choose to remember that my hope is in Jesus Christ. I also realize that we are people of community and that whatever event's, challenges or difficulties that are ahead, they are better faced by all of us together. For that is the way of Christ.

As we move forward together, may you know the blessing you are in my life!






Women's Book Group

Goal #3 Proclaim the Christian faith as their own:


Bring youth to the point in their faith journey that they feel ready to make a public proclamation of their Christian faith and become full members of the church.
