




# Summer at PUMC

Summertime is a time of refreshment and relaxation, a break in the routines of the rest of the year ... except at Plainfield UMC! We seem to be propelled along by, dare I say, Divine Momentum?! Something is certainly happening around here.

Workcamp was a major beginning to the summer as 37 youth plus 12 adults trekked to Kentucky to spend a week working on homes and numerous other tasks at Redbird Mission, impacting the lives around them in large and small ways, being the heart of Christ in their midst.

During the celebration when the work campers returned they shared moving stories of how their faith was impacted and where they saw God in their midst as they were in Kentucky. Supporting others in ministry is nothing new in this congregation, in fact it is one of the attributes that define it! (By the way, I am only "window dressing" in the above picture, although I was very supportive, and it was taken at 5 in the morning!

A number of months ago we were informed that the Chase Bank Building and additional parking lot were finally being listed for sale. With the blessing and full support of the Ad Council we entered the bidding process which played out slowly over the next three months culminating in our final offer to purchase being accepted by Chase. At this very moment we are in the process of doing our final due diligence. If everything continues the way it has, we will own that property before the end of August.



As if that was not enough going on, the church was approached with an offer to purchase the property contiguous to the corner parking lot.

The property known as 15122 S. Illinois includes a house extensively remodeled in the last few months. The owners offered it to us at a significant discount compared to what they were going to put it on the market for. Once again, the Ad Council was supportive and wanted to move forward to acquire the property. What followed was a Church Conference where every member could vote on the purchase of all the properties mentioned above. The vote to purchase the Chase properties was 100% in favor and the vote to purchase the contiguous property with the house was 96.7% in favor which makes the house the new parsonage and commits to selling the Indian Boundary parsonage to the sellers of the Illinois St. house.

Every year at Plainfield UMC one of the most inspiring, work intensive, and impactful ministries the church engages in is Vacation Bible School, 5 nights of adrenaline-fueled activities and lessons geared towards kids learning about Jesus' love for them and how they should share it. This year was no different! Wall to wall kids, youth, adult volunteers and guests turned out for 5 nights of high energy teaching and worship. True to form, planning for the 2020 VBS started the following week. (I am not "window dressing" in the above picture. ROBOT worked his tail off.)

So much for rest and relaxation. We are still in July while those events are behind us we are streaking towards our huge August event, which I call the REALLY REALLY, FREE FREE, MARKET MARKET. Even as I write this the church if filling up with all manner of furniture and other treasures donated in order to offer them to folks who may want them for free to enhance their lives or homes.

PUMC is a vital and vibrant congregation making a difference in this community and beyond. That is something you can all be righteously proud of, for I know God is!

Groom youth for a lifetime of praying, worshipping, giving, serving, leading, and witnessing.



### Really Really Free Market and job fair


